HISTORY OF REFUGEES IN MEMPHIS

Prior to World Relief Memphis' opening in 2012, Catholic Charities was the only resettlement agency in Memphis. Through their work, many families and individuals were resettled from Southeast Asia. In 2012, World Relief Memphis opened its doors for the first time after urging from the local church. Seeing the chance to be the hands and feet of Christ by welcoming and loving our neighbors, the local church had petitioned for World Relief to open a local office in Memphis.

Shortly thereafter, we began receiving our first families. Many refugees were coming from Iraq, Somalia, Burundi and Nepal, but over time we began receiving individuals from the Democratic Republic of Congo, Eritrea, Syria and South Sudan in addition to asylees from Cuba and Venezuela. In response to the recent events in Afghanistan, we have also begun welcoming Afghan parolees.
