

STATE IDENTIFICATION CARD



It is not necessary for newcomers to get a State ID upon arrival, as their Employment Authorization Card and I-94 should be sufficient forms of ID. However, obtaining a State ID can help the employment process and some employer might request for it.

Documents Needed (may vary state by state)

- Completed State ID Application
- Any application fee
- Other form of ID
- Proof of address
- Social Security card

Additional information

Obtaining a State ID is not a required core service of the R&P program. However, all case notes should be thorough and reflect all that occurred during the 90-day period, so if it was a service that was provided, please case note it.

Each state has its own set of requirements and procedures for obtaining an ID, so please check on your State DMV/DOT website and reach out to World Relief if you have any questions.

Organ Donor

The newcomer might be asked whether or not they would like to be an organ donor. Your team should communicate this with the newcomer beforehand, so that they fully understand the question. If there is any hesitation that the newcomer does not fully understand, the default answer should be “no.”
