A "budget" is a plan for how to spend your money. It is very important to understand how much money you have coming in (your "income") and how much money you have going out (your "expenses"). You always want your income to be greater than your expenses. Your caseworker will help you understand how to budget your money in your first few months here. If you ever have questions on budgets or finance your caseworker is here to help you. Below are some budgeting tips intended to help you save and allocate money.

Receipts – Always Save Them!

Save Extra Money!

- Once you have paid your bills, if there is money left, don't just spend it, save it!
- You may need the extra money in the future, save it!

Look For Ways To Get More Money

- Find a better job
- Look for additional work, such as overtime or a part-time job
- Consider having your spouse find additional work
