Learning English is essential to refugees and immigrant achieving self-sufficiency and a sense of deep belonging.

ESL (ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE) PROGRAMS

There may be several options for ESL classes for adults, all of which should be considered around employment prospects and schedules to encourage self-sufficiency. Your group will help with enrollment in an ESL program but can also assist with ongoing tutoring and language practice.

ADULT EDUCATION ESL COURSES

ESL classes are often available day and/or evenings and offered free of charge through local public schools or organizations. Some ESL classes may provide childcare. Childcare may be something to keep in mind if parents of little ones are also English language learners. Virtual ESL courses may also be available which could be an appropriate option.

COMMUNITY COLLEGE-BASED ESL COURSES

For refugees and immigrants who have a good baseline in English proficiency and could use more challenging coursework, community colleges offer ESL courses with financial aid (usually in the form of grants).

PRE-LITERACY COURSES

Some refugees and immigrants arrive with little to no formal schooling and may be preliterate in their own languages. There are English learning courses that are specific to preliterate students.

MEMBERS OF YOUR CONGREGATION OR COMMUNITY GROUP

You, members of your group, your congregation, or community group can offer to supplement formal ESL coursework with activities designed to facilitate English practice (e.g., movies, watching the news, cooking, practicing, etc.), especially once one or more of the adults in the household starts working.



ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNING RESOURCES

- You can take ESL classes for free at Adult Schools around Sacramento. These classes
 won't cost anything and are excellent. Community colleges also offer ESL, but they cost
 and will use up your financial aid, so that when you're ready to start your real college
 classes, your financial aid will be finished. So don't be tempted by ESL classes at
 college!
- Registration at the Adult Schools is open year-round except for summer. If the registration says "closed," check back in a few weeks, as registration opens and closes many times throughout the year.
- If you want to take a Citizenship class, your English level must be Beginning High or above. So you will need to study English for 2 or more years before you can register for a Citizenship class.
- All the Adult Schools (except Highlands) accept students ages 16 and older. Highlands students must be 22 years or older.

Learning another language takes time and practice. Starting early will help refugees and immigrants gain confidence and support their integration. It's also important to remember how much newcomers are learning and adjusting to. Communicating in a new language can be exhausting. There may be times when simply being together without talking will be a relief.
