At World Relief, we believe conversations can be powerful. 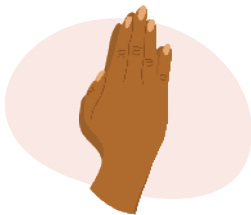

ACTION CARD

Support Local Immigrant-Owned Businesses

This week, choose one restaurant, store or service run by immigrants in your community. Make a purchase and thank them for being part of your community.

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ACTION CARD

Become a Church of Welcome

Gather with church leaders or your small group to discuss how your congregation can intentionally welcome immigrants and refugees. Use World Relief's Church Hub for resources.

DIFFICULTY TIERS

Every card has an icon to show its reflection tier:



Easy: Personal stories and observations. Good for starting conversations.



Medium: Invitations to hear and wrestle with perspectives and emotions.



Hard: Questions that challenge us to face hard truths, refine our perspectives and grow in courage.

HOW TO PLAY:

1. Begin by choosing a theme to explore: Home, Belonging or Loving Your Neighbor.
2. Place the deck for that theme in the center of the table.
3. Place, in separate piles, the Action cards and Prayer cards.
4. Whoever has the most recent birthday goes first by drawing one card from the theme pile and reads it out loud.
5. Share your response, then invite others to answer or reflect.

HOW TO USE THE DIFFICULTY TIERS

Option 1: You can shuffle all tiers together for variety.

Option 2: Start with Easy cards, move into Medium cards, and finish with Hard cards once the group feels ready.

Groups may skip a tier if needed — choose the pace that best fits your circle.

Lite Mode: For a more casual conversation, simply pull out a card from the different theme decks and discuss.

HOW TO PLAY:

6. Continue clockwise until everyone has had a chance to share, practicing active listening and respect.
7. After 3 rounds, draw an Action Card to discuss the suggestions on how the group can live out what was shared.
8. The game ends whenever you decide. End with a Prayer Card.

*Helpful tip: If at any point during the game the discussion gets too heated, draw a prayer card to recentre the group's hearts.



ACTION CARD

Serve Locally

Connect with your nearest World Relief office (or another trusted ministry) to volunteer: tutoring, helping with transportation or simply offering friendship.

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ACTION CARD

Start a Good Neighbor Team

Gather a group of friends, your small group or church community to form a Good Neighbor Team that partners with World Relief to walk alongside a newly arrived family.

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ACTION CARD

Increase Your Proximity

Invite a neighbor, coworker or classmate from an immigrant or refugee background to coffee, lunch or a walk. Listen to their story.

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ACTION CARD

Raise Your Voice for Justice

Call or email your representative to ask them to support compassionate, bipartisan immigration reform. Advocacy is discipleship in action.

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ACTION CARD

Practice Radical Hospitality

Set a date to host a meal where everyone brings a dish from their culture or tradition. Invite neighbors, friends or church members from immigrant and refugee backgrounds. Celebrate belonging together.

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ACTION CARD

Learn and Share

Pick one article, book or podcast about refugees or immigration this month. Share what you learn with your small group, family or social media network.

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ACTION CARD

Support The Path

Join World Relief's monthly giving community, The Path. Your ongoing gift sustains long-term work with immigrants and refugees worldwide.

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ACTION CARD

Pray With Your Feet

Organize or go on a prayer walk in your neighborhood or near your church. As you walk, pray for immigrant and refugee families in your city — for safety, welcome and belonging.

Afterward, take one step beyond prayer by finding a way to serve, give or speak out in support of your immigrant neighbors.

DIFFICULTY TIERS FOR KIDS

Every card has an icon to show its reflection tier:



Easy (entry points)



Medium (digging deep)



Hard: (honest, bold, courageous conversations)



HOW TO PLAY:

1. Begin by choosing a theme to explore: Home, Belonging or Loving Your Neighbor.
2. Place the deck for that theme in the center of the table.
3. Place, in separate piles, the Mini Action cards and Prayer cards.
4. Whoever has the most recent birthday goes first by drawing one card from the theme pile and reads it out loud.
5. Share your response, then invite others to answer or reflect.



HOW TO USE THE DIFFICULTY TIERS

Option 1: You can shuffle all tiers together for variety.

Option 2: Start with Easy cards, move into Medium cards, and finish with Hard cards once the group feels ready.

HOW TO PLAY:

6. After each turn, draw a Mini Action Card and complete the action. If you complete the challenge, you earn a token (use coins, beads, Legos, or anything handy).
7. Continue clockwise until, at least everyone has had a turn.
8. The player with the most tokens at the end chooses the BIG Action Challenge for the whole family to do together.
9. The game ends whenever you decide. End with a Prayer Card.
*Helpful tip: If at any point during the game the discussion gets too heated, draw a prayer card to recenter the group's hearts.





MINI-ACTION CARD

High-five or fist-bump each person at the table and say one word that makes them feel like they belong.

Pretend you are the “welcome team” at school, church or your neighborhood. How would you make someone feel included?

Imagine you had to welcome someone new into your home. Show what you'd do or say in 30 seconds.





PRAYER CARD

On Fear

"God, your perfect love takes away fear. When we feel afraid, help us to trust You and be brave. Show us how to choose love instead of fear." Amen.

Scripture: "Perfect love drives out fear." (1 John 4:18)



PRAYER CARD

On Displacement

"God, you are our safe place. We pray for kids and families who have had to leave their homes. Please keep them safe and give them peace. Help us to see them with Your love." Amen.

Scripture: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble." (Psalm 46:1)



PRAYER CARD

On Unjust Deportation

"God of justice, it makes us sad when families are split apart or treated unfairly. Please protect them. Show us how to do what's right, love mercy and walk humbly with You." Amen.

Scripture: "Do what is right, love mercy, and walk humbly with your God." (Micah 6:8)



PRAYER CARD

On Belonging

"Lord, You put people in families and give us friends. Help us make space for others so they feel like they belong. May our words and actions show your welcome." Amen

Scripture: "God sets the lonely in families." (Psalm 68:6)



MINI-ACTION CARD

In 30 seconds, act out something you'd miss most if you had to leave your home suddenly.



MINI-ACTION CARD

Pretend you're cheering someone on who feels nervous or scared. What do you say?



MINI-ACTION CARD

Close your eyes and in 30 seconds, describe with only single words, a smell that reminds you of home.
(Example for chocolate chip cookies: sweet, Christmas, baked, round, warm, etc.)



MINI-ACTION CARD

Make a heart with your hands and then say something encouraging to the person on your right.





MINI-ACTION CARD

Do a silly face or action that could cheer someone up if they were sad.



MINI-ACTION CARD

Pretend you're visiting someone who just moved in from another country — what would you bring them as a welcome gift? Show or describe it



MINI-ACTION CARD

Share a prayer of thanks for something about your home.



MINI-ACTION CARD

Share one way you could show kindness to someone this week.



PRAYER CARD

Closing the Game

"Lord, thank You for our time together. Send us out to love our neighbors, welcome others and speak the truth with kindness. Help us love like You love us." Amen.

ACTION CARD

Try Something New

Eat a meal or snack from another culture. Talk as a family about what you liked and what you learned.



MINI-ACTION CARD

(Answer: Abrahram, Ruth, Joseph, Mary and Joseph with Jesus.



ACTION CARD

Be a Lunch Buddy

At school, at the park or at church this week, invite someone new or someone sitting alone to join you and your friends.



ACTION CARD

Share a Meal

Invite someone new — a classmate, a neighbor or a church friend — to join your family for dinner or dessert.



ACTION CARD

Pray for a Family

Families have had to leave their homes in countries like Sudan and Ukraine. Say a prayer for children and families there.

Make a Welcome Card

Draw or write a card to welcome a new neighbor, classmate or family at church. Share it with them this week.
